

The fill further authorizes the appointment of an ombudsperson to facilitate communication on recycled water issue and the authorization of fees to support these causes.

- A subcommittee has been put together a formal respond to SB-201, an apparently erroneous bill proposed by Representative Florez to address the spinach e-coli incident of 2006. The bill has the potential for double monitoring and potential for regrowth, which will be a technical debate.
- The State WRCB may issue a draft recycled water policy for public review and is going to conduct a workshop. Some of the issues will be mass balance concept versus monitoring wells. Concentrated aquifer storage in the policy may delay the draft polity.
- Dan Lafferty has been named the Chief Deputy for Recycled Water for the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works. Dan discussed that he wants to meet with all the recycled water agencies in order to implement the approximately 30 recommendations from the Recycled Water Task Force. Dan discussed that LADPW will take the lead on implementing recycled water projects in the unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County.
- AB 640: The bill proposes that DWR establish standard assessment for CBMWD and WBMWD. WBMWD is opposing this current bill.
- IRWD Bill: The bill will make it legal to have recycled water for toilet flushing in condominiums. Potential owners will be informed via CC&R's. Currently there is no opposition.

6. Other Items

- a. John Robinson updated the group and indicated that the joint meeting with Los Angeles, Orange County, Inland Empire and San Diego chapters of WaterReuse would be conducted in August or October with several papers being presented. Suggested topics were regulatory (update and moving forward with updating the WaterReuse Foundation), Signing and guidance, discussion regarding cross-connection procedures, Appendix J, climate change impacts and how to expand recycled water locally. Carlos Borja indicated that the County DGS does not require strict compliance to Title 22 on signage wording, color, etc and would provide a presentation on the sign examples.
- b. Earle Hartling indicated that he has information from Las Virgenes and City of Burbank. Earle indicated the need to show fire fighting officials consistent quality (Turbidity and BOD) and quantity. The three major concerns from fire fighting officials are 1. safety of water for fire fighters, 2. cleaning and disinfecting fire trucks (discussed chemical foaming agents and the procedure to clean and disinfect fire trucks after that occurrence and 3. recycled water for interior fire fighting (discussion on biological growth due to non-use and ways to avoid this issue with the Sky Rose Chapel at Rose Hills utilized as an example). Earle indicated that a draft would be completed in the next several months (projected for August meeting).
- c. Carlos Borja provided an updated on the draft stormwater reuse guideline manual currently in progress. Carlos discussed the grey water system in Santa Monica utilizing purple pipe as an example of why this storm water reuse guideline needs to be developed. The group discussed storm water runoff to be incorporated into the manual as well as cisterns system with recycled water on site as well. Carlos is to provide the storm water/cistern water guidelines in order to be distributed to the membership. Bill vanWagoner stated that there is a meeting being planned at the City of Los Angeles to discuss this issue and was going to send the information to Carlos.

- d. David Garcia discussed on-site supervisor training and it was discussed that WaterReuse has developed a Site Supervisor training Manual for users of recycled water that is now available on their web site as well as the information developed by the San Diego, which is on the LACRWAC website.

7. Next Meeting Place

Pat Robinson indicated that Long Beach would be able to host the meeting at the Long Beach WRF and looking for a sponsor to provide lunch. Stefan Cajina indicated that State DHS would make a presentation on groundwater recharge at the June meeting.
